CSIRO's prestigious undergraduate Vacation Studentship scheme has a well-established track record over the past 20 years in attracting the brightest and best of the next generation of scientists. We offer you the opportunity to partner with CSIRO in fostering the careers of young researchers in agriculture and food science, ensuring that the best young minds of today consider working in your industry and are aware of your organisation*.

The projects

- advertised nation-wide
- open to third year undergraduate students of an appropriate discipline
- allocated in a competitive process
- typically ~10 applicants for each place
- currently offering ~16 projects encompassing all aspects of our agricultural research, including crop science, animal welfare and behaviour, and plant genomics.

How does it work?

- projects run for 10 weeks in December/January
- students receive an attractive stipend
- projects conclude with a Summer Research Student Symposium in late January
- many students return for Honours, Masters or PhD projects.

Examples of projects in 2024-25

- Crop residue composites as a base for a broadacre mulch
- Fall Armyworm Identification Using Light-Trap Cameras and Deep Learning
- Developing a bio-economic model for quantifying the benefits of effective disease management for sustainable cropping systems.
